The blessed Apostle Matthew quotes the prophecy of Isaiah about the birth of our Lord: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel, which means, God with us" (1:23). In the fullness of time, the Light of God, whom the prophets and generations eagerly awaited, came and took birth in this world. He came to bring heaven down to earth and to be with His creation. At the same time, reckon that, Jesus has not promised: there won't be any suffering or pain for His faithful. But He told: "In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." (John 16:33). The proponents of the so called 'gospel of prosperity' are the false prophets, who misguide people for their vested motives. But what really matters is, whether Jesus Christ is with us. He told: Abide in me, and I in you (John 15:4). His promise to be with us, is never failing. Hence we should never allow fear or worries about future, dominate our spiritual life. Wait for God. His presence with us and His loving grace and power, will open new doors for us and enable us to go ahead with a renewed zest and vigour. May the celebrations of this Christmas enable us to open our doors for our God-Immanuel and let Him be with us. We wish you all a Blessed New Year and extend our Apostolic blessings to you. May the grace of God be with you all.
